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PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

Project Description: Describe the scope, location, equipment identification.

Purchase a two seat semi enclosed utility vehicle able to tow the mower the 70 miles required, along with the ability to haul miscellaneous tools, brush, etc. on airport. Vehicle to be maneuverable enough for mowing operations. Vehicle does not have to be legal for off airport use.

Various used gas or diesel powered vehicles are being considered.

Project Justification and Consequences of not funding: Describe how this project furthers CPAD goals and the negative impact of not funding.

Operation and Maintenance of the airport requires;

- 1. Travel around airport for inspections, oversight of work
- 2. Towing mower and spraying equipment
- 3. Hauling brush and tree parts to burn pile locations on airport

The District presently owns an older electric golf cart and no other vehicles.

- 1. Existing golf cart is failing and it cannot pull the mower enough distance or on the slopes.
- 2. Mowing is a critical task and is dependent on a vehicle capable of towing the mower and maneuvering around the airport.
- 3. Vehicles suitable for mowing must be borrowed or rented. Borrowed equipment is subject to the generosity of volunteers and their availability. Rental equipment runs approximately \$150 a day up to \$750 a day if an integral mower is included. Loaned equipment is not always available and time is lost seeking equipment and waiting for it to be available.
- 4. The District is liable for any loaned or borrowed equipment damage and fuel for operation.
- 5. We recently lost the use of a pull vehicle and had to expend a lot of extra labor time to prep for a CalTrans visit using alternative weed whacking equipment.



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Project Schedule: Describe the required schedule. Discuss implications of schedule delays.

Routine mowing is currently held up due to lack of a vehicle. The golf cart is becoming increasingly unreliable stranding users without warning apparently due to temperature issues.

This proposed vehicle is multi-purpose and covers on airport requirements, mowing, spraying, airport hauling, and inspections. It will replace the golf cart with additional towing and hauling capability.

- 1. Loaned vehicles work, but are dependent on their owners providing them when needed, extra effort was recently required to prep for an inspection while negotiations for another vehicle were underway.
- 2. Rental costs quickly add up to the purchase price and required additional effort or cost to pick up and return.
- 3. Repairing the golf cart at its age is not fiscally responsible and it does not provide the towing and hauling capability required

Slightly increased operating costs for maintenance, already buying fuel. Savings in labor hours due to availability as needed offset the maintenance costs
