- In work by McMurchie Law
 - Specializes in Special District
 - Question and documents sent
 - Written opinion by about December 15
 - Fixed Fee: \$1,500
- <u>Unofficial</u> feedback so far
 - Airport District, as special district is not a state agency
 - Airport districts to not possess land use planning authority, which is reserved to cities and counties.
 - The airport district does retain authority over real property which it owns.

Water & Soda Vending Machine Agreement

As a service to pilots and passengers, instructors and students, have cold water and sodas available


- Vending Machine service provider American River Vending
- No cost to CPAD, other than electricity
 - Offset by revenue from sales
 - CPAD receives 3% of Gross revenue on beverage items
- American River Vending is responsible for
 - Installing their machine
 - Stocking and maintaining the machine
- Water \$1.00, Soda \$1.50
- Cash and credit card
 - Credit card transaction via cellular telephone link
- Termination: Either party may terminate the agreement at any time with or without cause upon 90 days' prior written notice.
- Term: An initial term of 12 Months. Upon the expiration of such term (or any renewal term), the agreement shall automatically renew for an additional 1 years period unless either party notifies the other party at least 30 days prior to the applicable renewal date of its intention not to renew the agreement.
- Counsel Review: Agreement is completely standard. Nothing to note or suggested changes.





FAA Weather Camera Program & 061

- FAA Weather Camera Program Agreement
 - Originated in Alaska to improve safety by showing skies at participating airport. Extended to continental US.
 - Currently a gap around our area

 - To enhance operations and safety flying into O61
 - Help enhance safety for flights near O61







FAA Weather Camera Program & 061

- Four Cameras
 - Two on the airport office looking South and North
 - Two on the light shed looking at Pine Hill and other East
- Plan is to install two other cameras on the light shed showing Pine Hill and the other looking east to see cloud build ups over the Sierra's.
- There are existing separate security cameras on the fuel shed, which the feeds are not public.
- The FAA will poll cameras about every 7 to 10 minutes to capture still images at the time when polled.
- It is not known how long the FAA retains images. The FAA website loops are about 6-hours.
- URLs for the cameras are not public. FAA treats it as confidential.
